The Division of Pediatric Emergency Medicine at the Hospital for Sick Children is pleased to accept candidate applications for its Research Fellowship.

Research at The Hospital for Sick Children

At The Hospital for Sick Children, we are committed to providing children with the highest quality of care. Approximately 70,000 children and their families turn to the Emergency Department each year for care and help. The Division of Paediatric Emergency Medicine carries out research in many different areas, such as acute respiratory illnesses, toxicology, musculoskeletal injuries, trauma, quality, medical education, and point-of-care ultrasound. A research council and a dedicated student-based volunteer program has been established to facilitate and coordinate research from within the Division as well as promote the collaboration with other paediatric centres nationally and internationally. The Hospital for Sick Children is a world-class research centre with highly skilled infrastructure, education sessions, and mentorship.

Eligibility

A post-graduate trainee who will have completed two years of an academic pediatric emergency medicine fellowship by the start date of the research fellowship is eligible to apply. Ideally, the candidate will have successfully completed a research project during their core PEM fellowship and has the desire to make research their academic focus within pediatric emergency medicine. External funding is not required for PEM fellows who have completed a Royal College subspecialty training program in PEM, and who are eligible for an independent license in Ontario.

Length of Fellowship

This is a one year fellowship that will start July 1 2016.

Fellowship Program

Alongside clinical shifts in the emergency department, the PEM research fellow will build the foundations of conducting high quality research. Together with strong mentorship, the goal is to have the research fellow focus on one main project that will include the experience of writing a grant and complete formal courses in Health Research Methodology.
